Please support your child and our goal of achieving academic excellence by making sure that we take care of the little matters each day:

- 1. If the student is in person, students should arrives to school between 7:45 a.m. and 8:05 a.m. to allow for enough time to get breakfast and to be in first period class on time and without interruption of learning

Math News

Pre-Algebra

Mrs. Holmes

Students in Mrs. Holmes' pre-algebra class are studying transformations of figures, including translations, reflections, rotations, and dilations. He or she will apply transformations to determine whether figures are congruent or similar. Your child is also learning about angle relationships, such as the relationships among angles in a triangle and among angles created by different types of lines.

7th grade Math

Mileti- As we move into March, we will focus on the 7th grade Geometry Standards. Through 2 different units, Plane geometry, area, perimeter of all Shapes, and surface area of 3 dimensional shapes.

Mrs. Holmes and Mr. McWilliams

Students are wrapping up the unit on solving equations and inequalities and they are moving onto analyzing surveys and other studies in which a population is sampled. He or she will be learning to identify samples that are representative and to make inferences based on samples. Your child will also be comparing sample data by using different types of data displays and measures such as mean, median, and mean absolute deviation. Afterwards, students will be studying probabilities of simple and compound events.

At Garfield, we believe that students and staff members should...


